





Center Stations

Glow-in-the-Dark Storytelling:

Set up a cozy reading area with dimmed lights and provide glow sticks or flashlights for families to read books together. Encourage families to engage their children in storytelling using the glow sticks to highlight different parts of the story.

Glow-in-the-Dark Word Search:

Create glow-in-the-dark word search puzzles using phosphorescent markers or glow-in-the-dark paint. Design word searches with age-appropriate vocabulary related to reading, literacy, or the event theme. Offer small prizes for completed word searches.

Glow-in-the-Dark Art Corner:

Set up a glow-in-the-dark art station where children and families can create glow-themed artwork. Provide glow paints, markers, and blacklight to enhance the effect. Encourage them to draw scenes from their favorite books or create their own glowing masterpieces.

Center Stations

Galactic Read

Aloud:

Choose a book from the read aloud list to read to students and their families. You can use Virginia Literacy Partnership's read aloud questions to guide the conversation with students and their families.

Space Scavenger

Hunt:

Provide a list of words related to space (moon, star, rocket, etc). Encourage families to go on a scavenger hunt where they find objects in the room that start with the same initial sounds as the given word.

Reading Rocket

Relay:

Organize a relay race where families take turns reading sentences related to space. Each participant reads a sentence fluently before passing the reading task to the next family member. This encourages expressive reading and improves fluency.
